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*Richard J. Fehring, D.N.Sc., RN.* is a Professor and Director of the Marquette University College of Nursing Institute for Natural Family Planning. He received his masters and doctorate in nursing science from Catholic University of America. He is a current member of the National Advisory Board to the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) for Natural Family Planning and is editor of “Current Medical Research” (a USCCB publication). He is a past president of the American Academy of Fertility Care Professionals and Chair of the Academy’s Science and Research Committee. His research interests include clinical application of new technology for fertility monitoring and marital dynamics of family planning.

She edits *The Journal of the Historical Society*, is a member of the editorial boards of *Voices* and *Books & Culture*, of the editorial advisory board of *First Things*, and of the Board of Directors of the Fellowship of Catholic Scholars. She served as an expert witness for the Virginia Military Institute and The Citadel.

Jeff Koloze, Ph.D. is full-time instructor of English at Clark State Community College in Springfield, Ohio. Previously, he had been adjunct faculty for thirteen years at several colleges and universities in metropolitan Cleveland, Ohio.
